Frequently Asked Questions

Are children welcome on board?

Yes they are, but they must be at least 5 years old and able to wear a lifejacket to go with you on a charter. Unlike our other boats F8 is quiet and more sedate..

Where do we start our trip?

Your trip will begin in Portsmouth Historic Dockyard, a representative of PNBPT will greet you at the main entrance to Boathouse 4 and take you to the Pontoon.

How fast will I get to go?

The top speed of F8 is about 10 knots.

How many people can go on a trip?

F8 can take up to ten passengers.

Do you provide life jackets?

Yes we do, please make sure you let us know on booking, the number and weight of any children so we can ensure we have the correct life jackets. Passengers will not be allowed on the boat without a lifejacket.

Do we need to crew the boat?

No, we provide all necessary crew and a Skipper. All we would like you to do is enjoy yourselves and make sure that you do as the Skipper says for your own safety.

Is there easy access on to the boat?

You will be required to step from the Pontoon onto the boat. You will be assisted but if you have any concerns that you or someone from your group will not be able to do this then please do contact us and we will be able to advise further. Because of the unique nature of the ramp on F8 she is wheelchair and limited mobility accessible, please talk to us before you book to ensure that we can make suitable arrangements and check tide heights.

What should I wear?

Essentially dress for the weather as there is nowhere to go and hide from the elements on this boat. Please do not wear a skirt as the lifejackets have crotch straps that must be correctly worn. We suggest you bring a waterproof jacket, a hat, and that you wear soft soled shoes that lace up so that they aren't loose, high heel shoes are not allowed. If it is sunny please ensure that you wear sunscreen as it is easy to get sunburnt when on the water.
